1. European Funding Programmes -> Wide range of opportunities for researchers

Projects funded by the European Union through research and innovation programmes play an important role for researchers and their institutions. These funds do not only provide financial support, but also encourage collaboration, internationalisation and innovation, thus contributing to scientific, societal and economic development.







1. European Funding Programmes -> Wide range of opportunities for researchers

Financial support and strengthening research capacities

EU funding programmes, in particular Horizon Europe, have significant budgets. For the period 2021-2027, Horizon Europe has a budget of almost €95.5 billion to support research and innovation. This funding enables researchers to carry out ambitious studies, some of which are highly exploratory and often inaccessible with national funding alone.

Collaboration and International Networking

Researchers and institutions are encouraged to collaborate with peers from different countries, promoting the sharing of knowledge and practices. With collaborations involving on average between 5 and 10 partners per project, European projects enable universities to join large-scale consortia and strengthen their presence on the international research landscape.

Training and Mobility of Researchers


European programmes encourage the mobility of researchers and the development of their skills. Marie Skłodowska-Curie actions and Erasmus+, for example, support academic exchanges and offer researchers training opportunities in recognised European institutions.

Impacts on innovation and society

By addressing challenges such as climate change, public health or the digital transition, European research projects enable researchers to develop innovative solutions with a high societal and economic impact.

Example of the Horizon Europe programme




